We are partnering with an area company, Second Nature, to place recycling kiosks in all of Papillion's city parks to promote sustainability and keep these shared spaces beautiful for years to come. We hope that all Sarpy County cities will ultimately adopt this program.

We are asking for your help in sponsoring Second Natures' patented recycling kiosks at the following locations: Halleck Park, Papio Bay Aquatic Center, City Park, 1st Street Plaza, Tara Hills Golf Course, Eagle Hills Golf Course, Sumter Amphitheater, Walnut Creek and Prairie Queen Recreation Areas and once completed the new Papillion Landing Community Center. With your help, we can divert the trash collected at these locations from the public landfills to a recyclable material processing facility.

The Mayor and the City of Papillion strongly supports this program and ask for you to join our cause.
